4) Minutes of meeting on 1st September

The defibrillator has been checked and the battery changed. KMA is now the registered owner and guardian of the unit.

Construction of a new footbridge on the Aber Right of Way has commenced with the approval of the adjacent landowners.

The involvement of Friends of Loch Lomond was questioned. FoLL have arranged funding from the LLTNPA and other sources unknown to KCT or KCC for the bridge. There are questions over the future responsibility—a meeting with the NP was proposed to clarify technical and legal responsibility. However, should FoLL be planning construction of a new path over the route of the existing Right of Way, this will require a planning application.

FoLL are thought to be also proposing work on the Dumpling footpath. KCT have been asked (by FoLL) to fund some new informational signage. FoLL are due to attend the next KCT meeting. We await an update their proposals.

Internal works on the Old Kirk have been completed. There is a service planned for 16th November to celebrate the 700th anniversary since Robert the Bruce authorised the Abbots of Cambuskenneth to hold services at Kilmaronock.

8) Correspondence

Police Scotland

There were five recorded crimes in the area since the date of the last meeting.

Trees at Gartocharn Church

Regarding the recent sale of the church, a concern was expressed that the new owner could cut down all the trees within the grounds, some or all of which may have historic or cultural value. The planning authority are responsible for granting Tree Preservation Orders. The process involves an initial Tree Evaluation which we can request they implement.

It was discussed that they may be covered by the Listed Building Status of the church.

Action: KCC (AS) to request a tree evaluation survey by LLTNPA with the aim of preserving the trees.

Vale of Leven Wind Farm Update

Public Local Inquiry process – posted on KCC website

"The PLI process involves a Reporter from the Scottish Government's Planning and Environmental Appeals Division to be appointed to conduct the inquiry (ref: WIN-160-1). We expect the PLI will take place in mid 2026 - with a pre determination hearing later this year or early 2026. The Reporter will consider all the evidence and will then provide a report and recommendation to the Scottish Ministers to assist in their eventual determination of the application. Due to the PLI process, we expect a determination to be made in mid 2027 although we have based this on estimates of other PLI processes for S36 applications."

Roadwork Management Communications

lan Sweetland, resident, has been in correspondence with KCC about the lack of response from WDC and other bodies. He met with MSP Jackie Baillie and she will be arranging a meeting with him and Roads dept. to which KCC are invited. This is also of relevance to the CC Forum members, as all WDC community councils report the same lack of response issues.

KCC(AS) to follow up

CC Forum

A special meeting is being convened on Wed 12th November to which several elected members have committed to attend. This is to start the process of the review of the Scheme of Establishment of CC's within WD.

Local Development Plan Update

An Evidence Report has been created following the stage consultation responses. This will be submitted for Gate Check Review by ScotGov. Timelines for the LDP process have been updated. Next stage is identification of sites and ideas for inclusion in the Plan.

Woodlands Trust

The site meeting was documented with a schedule for clearance of plastic tubes as follows. "Tube removal in area 1b –These are down for removal by 2027/28

Tubes piled up in bundles beside path (also other random tubes in proximity) these will be removed by 31 May 2026.

Mouse tubes in new plantation - These will definitely be removed by 31 May 2026. I have asked our contractors to do this before winter and they have promised to prioritise it."

Fencing around Private Water Supplies will only be reinstated if need arises. Meantime planting of thorny hedging will take place to discourage access over sensitive ground.

9) AOB

Discussion on private sewage treatment standards and discharges into watercourses feeding into the Loch.

Concern that planning rules within LLTNPA don't have stricter practice on checking sufficiency of waste treatment entering watercourses. GM will discuss with NS and seek a contact with SEPA.

10) Presentation from Patricia Rowley *CEng MICE* and Gail Macfarlane WDC Chief Officer describing the regeneration project at the former Exxon Terminal at Bowling.

Patricia is the Capital Projects Manager of the Capital Investment Team at WDC, Gail is chief officer for Roads & Neighbourhood which includes Roads & Transport, Greenspace & Waste Management and Corporate Asset & Fleet Management.

The project was described in full and the stages explained.

Followed by a Q&A discussion session.

Among the suggestions made were:

- Installation of a statement artwork to welcome folk to Dumbarton and hopefully divert some of them to the town (to increase footfall to castle/maritime museum/hospitality). The "Squareabout" or Dunglass Roundabout would be ideal locations.
- Adding a rail stop within the site although acknowledged that Bowling station is within 1 mile of the site centre.
- Adding a bus service route through the site for commuters.
- Support for the improvement to heritage site at Dunglass Castle as a visitor experience.
- Consideration of the site for micro-power generation specifically a Small Modular Nuclear Reactor tapping into expertise in the region from Faslane operations.
- Promote the access to the river for offshore tech applications in line with the development of the Scottish Marine Technical Park in Old Kilpatrick.

Crimes/Offences that have occurred in community area since last meeting	There were five recorded crimes in the Community Council area since the date of their last meeting in September 2025.
	Two of these matters relate to speeding offences, whereby both drivers were in excess of the prescribed speed limit of 30mph. Both were issued a conditional offer of 3 penalty points and £100 fine.
	One crime relates to a theft of fuel. The registered keeper of the vehicle has been identified but enquiries continue to trace due to them living out with the local division.
	One crime also relates to a vandalism of a contactless payment machine which occurred overnight. No persons have been identified as it occurred overnight and there is no CCTV opportunities.
	Lastly, a driver was issued a vehicle defect ticket for having a registration plate that did not adhere to size and spacing regulations. Should he comply, then he would not be criminalised.
	Police have dealt with a number of incidents in the area since the time of the last meeting but these have overwhelmingly been for non-criminal matters such as general requests for assistance and road traffic matters.
